Our first team finished third in the Premier league behind an all conquering Smeeth side and Skippers (who are being promoted to the County league next season). WOODCHURCH SURGERY UPDATE

The sun has finally made an appearance at the end of June and is sure to stay (?). As previously mentioned please remember that UVA and UVB both need protection from and put on Factor 50 regularly. Some skin cancers are slow growing over years of historic exposure and some are rapidly

growing so please report new mole changes and any non-healing skin nodules/ulcers. Moles are part of the skin so can itch and even bleed but if it doesn't revert back to normal within a week of moisturising and covering up then come and show us.



We try not to mention the "C" word if we can help it now. We're pretty happy with Christmas being less than 6 months away but Covid is coming back... Rates are a bit higher in the community at the moment and with that we have news of our latest immunisation program. We are due to start a new contract to immunise from September but are unlikely to get any vaccines until October.

The cohorts are likely to be the same as last year - over 65s and those that are entitled to the flu jab for health reasons (although we don't know for sure). The current program for Spring vaccines finished at the end of June ensuring that there are at least 3 months before the new vaccines come and therefore safe to vaccinate everyone again. Please don't bother trying to get a vaccine now as they won't be available until we start in October.

We will be doing some "Big Weekends" to get the community engaged in the vaccines which were a great success last year but news of these are likely to be communicated in September when we have more concrete detail.

In the meantime, we had some exposure on BBC News celebrating the success of our PCN project doing a couch to 5k. A really experienced health coach, Steve Grantham, has done courses in Charing and Tenterden for patients in our locality. The idea has been to get people running but some

walk and the real focus is on helping people get out and help with physical and mental health. The feedback is amazing and people have stayed in touch and supported each other. The next course starts on 8th July and still has a few places. Please contact the surgery and get involved.

She has been a great asset but chosen to find work helping to assess children's educational needs and while we wish her well, we will miss her greatly. Fortunately we have had some strong candidates to join us in this position and hope to appoint soon.

For the rest, we expect some quiet times with England involved in the Euros, a Cricket T20, Wimbledon, Olympics and some good weather absorbing peoples' lives. There must be some stats involving the stress/benefits of being a sports' supporter but I suspect it is too complicated to make sense of - please just enjoy the moments.

Make A Difference





It was a chilly, June evening (apparently on account of all the cold air currently being drawn down across the UK from Greenland, with a wind that was so cold that poor Taylor Swift, performing in Edinburgh last weekend, was obliged to request gloves and a cardigan to add to her rather scanty costume), and yet all was convivial and warm at our WI meeting. The weather did not act as a deterrent and the President was delighted to be able to greet so many members and, also, to welcome four new ladies, who had come on account of Nicole's recent recruitment drive at the highly successful Woodchurch Carnival!

Jane Scotchmer was our Speaker for the evening with her illustrated talk entitled "Guatemala - A Land of Terrible Beauty"! She hoped that, as the words "terrible" and "beauty" are not words one would normally associate together, we would, hopefully, by the end, come to understand why this title (an oxymoron) had been chosen. Guatemala, a country in Central America, is bordered to the



north and west by Mexico, to the north east by Belize to the east by Honduras, and to the south east by El Salvador and it also borders the Pacific Ocean and the Gulf of Honduras. It is a land of volcanos, earthquakes, rainforests and ancient Mayan sites; a land with a large illegal immigration problem and an active narcotics trade.

Jane, having recently completed an Open University Degree in French and Spanish (Spanish is the predominant language used in Guatemala, although the indigenous population still have their own languages) decided to join her daughter, Heather, on her travels and the pair met in Guatemala City, the capital and most populous urban area in Central America. However, they were both anxious to visit the "real" Guatemala and so moved on and during their three week holiday, were able to get off the beaten track, staying in hostels, visiting Coban, the Mayan ruins, Xela, the Pacaya Volcano, Lake Atitlan (formed in a massive volcanic crater and surrounded by coffee fields and little villages), Livingston, Flores and Antigua, a small city built on the Pacific Ring of Fire and so surrounded by three volcanos.

Not all the slides depicted glorious sunshine and on one occasion mother and daughter were caught in a torrential storm. The terrain was wild and rugged and even the sand on the beaches was made up of black volcanic dust, so it was easy to perceive why the title "A Land of Terrible Beauty" was so apt. Thank you, Jane, for allowing us an insight into this untamed land - so very different to Woodchurch!

Our next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, 9th July 7.15 pm in the Memorial Hall and it will be our OPEN EVENING, and everyone is invited to attend. The Speaker will be Mr. David Tadd on "The Forensic Response to the Asian Tsunami" so do please join us if you feel that might be of interest to you. 



- An outline of the project or reason you require the money. This should include:
 - o A description of the project or purchase.
 - o Who will benefit from the project or purchase.
 - o The overall cost of the project or purchase.
 - o How much you have already raised for this project or purchase.

Applications should be addressed to Woodchurch Carnival Committee C/O the Hub, no later than Wednesday 10th July 2024.
