interests of safety please ensure that passersby have safe passage past. Contrary to popular belief, hedges maybe trimmed during the nesting season, provided there aren't any birds nesting in the hedge concerned. If in doubt you can have them inspected by an accredited wildlife officer prior to cutting. 

Dear Friends.

I am writing this on a wet gloomy day in May - I hope by the time you are reading it we have a bright warm day in June!



I am delighted to announce that our three parishes have now become the united Parish of Denswood. taking the "Dens" from High Haden and Bethersden, and the Wood from Woodchurch. Our combined parish has a population of around 6,000 people, with three parish churches of All Saints, St Mary's and St Margaret's, three schools, two residential/nursing homes, a mental health care facility, GP surgery, 6 pubs (I think!), shops, businesses and of course lots of residential properties. If you live in our parish you are a parishioner (whether you come to church or not), and have a right to be married in any of our churches whatever your faith. The Church of England parish system seeks to be inclusive and welcomes everyone, and I try to be as available as possible to anyone or everyone who might need a chat or more practical help - do get in touch if there is anything you would like to discuss.

The services and events offered by our three churches will not change, with most Sundays having a service in each village, but with some special days when we all come together in one church to celebrate and worship. All our churches belong to the Inclusive church network, which means we aim to be welcoming to everyone especially those who may have felt marginalised or rejected in the past by churches.

By uniting parishes we hope to pool our gifts and resources. Like many organisations we have found it harder to find volunteers to be on church committees. All of our churches are historic Grade 1 listed building with shopping lists of maintenance and improvement works, and we know the importance of staying connected with our local village communities to help us keep going. Our new committee Denswood PCC will be made up of people from each of our three church committees. We are looking forward to seeing how we can grow our church communities in the future.

### WOODCHURCH SURGERY UPDATE

Whooping cough has made a resurgence with at least ten times the normal reported number of cases in the first quarter of 2024. Whooping cough is also called "pertussis" which comes from the Latin - "per" meaning through and "tussis" meaning cough - makes sense really. We've dumbed it down more recently to also being called the 100-day cough.

It is characterised by very intensive and uncontrollable coughing fits which typically causes the person to make a high-pitched "whooping" sound when trying to take a deep breath in after coughing. The coughing can be so severe that people feel that they are choking, may vomit or faint during a spell. These symptoms are caused as the bacteria makes the upper airways swell so that they are narrowed and can go into spasm. For most people this is very unpleasant but recoverable, the most at risk of severe illness and death are babies and infants who already have small airways. Breathing techniques can help reduce some of the unpleasantness in adults and reduce the risk of fainting.

In the UK the vaccination programme starts vaccinating babies at 3 months and since 2012 pregnant women have been offered vaccines from 25 to 32 weeks to protect babies during the first 3 months. Unfortunately, the uptake is poor at only about 60% so leaving approximately 40% of babies at risk in their early months.

Symptoms start with a normal cough/cold which is usually mild until the severe cough starts at 2-3 weeks. It is very

contagious and spread through the cough droplets in the air. The guidance is: Suspect pertussis in patients with a cough illness lasting 14 days or more without an apparent cause plus one of the



following: (a) paroxysms of coughing (ie uncontrollable coughing fits); (b) inspiratory 'whoop'; (c) post-tussive vomiting.

If it is suspected, then a swab is taken from the back of the nose and antibiotics are started. The antibiotics help reduce the severity in the early stages and are generally not considered effective if taken after 3 weeks of the start of the illness. In all cases after treatment the cough will still continue in some form for 2 to 3 months. It is important to isolate for 48 hours after the start of treatment to avoid spreading it.

Any positive cases are reported to the Department of Health as they are a "notifiable disease" so that cases can be monitored. There were spikes back in 2012 and 2016 so it has always been with us. We have asked the lab for swabs so we can test for it. If you think you or your child may have it please stay outside the building until called in to avoid spreading it within the waiting area.

Our most notable Surgery news is that Lauren James, our trainee GP, has passed all her exams with flying colours and is expected to complete her training at the end of July. It really is a pleasure to see doctors come to Woodchurch and be so welcomed by everyone, making it a great learning environment. I have no doubt that she will have a very successful career ahead of her.

While the Summer has continued to be very busy in the Surgery, we look forward to the long evenings for the next few weeks. Best wishes on behalf of the Surgery

## WOODCHURCH REMEMBERS D-DAY 6TH JUNE 1944

The 6th June 2024 marks the 80<sup>th</sup>
Anniversary of the Normandy landings that began the campaign that liberated Western
Europe from Nazi occupation. To mark the event a national beacon lighting will take place at 9-15 PM and Woodchurch will be part of that. Programme as follows.

- 8.50 PM: Wreaths will be laid at the War Memorial in the Churchyard and by the Commemorative Oak near the Memorial Hall.
- 9.15: Lighting of the Village Beacon and ringing of All Saints Church Bells. At this point a tribute to those connected to Woodchurch who took part in the invasion and subsequent campaign will be read out.

Capt FA Keller, Lt Wetherell, Capt Brock, 2Lt Harris, Lt Heitman, Capt Van Deventner, Lt O'Hara, Capt Adams and Lt Gibbons. All from The USAAF Thunderbolt Sqn based at Woodchurch.

Private Amos Fairbrother, presumed Killed In Action at Arnhem, serving with the First Airborne Division. Pte Fairbrother is remembered on the Woodchurch War Memorial.

On display near the Commemorative Oak will be the D- Day Remembrance Plane. This has been built by The Woodchurch Village Shed, funded by Woodchurch Carnival and assisted by Woodchurch in Bloom, the Scouts and ourselves. The model is in commemoration of the airmen who served at Woodchurch and died over Europe during the Normandy Campaign.

Watch out for us at the carnival on Saturday 8<sup>th</sup>, all ex-service personnel are invited to march behind our standard on the parade that opens the event.

### **Woodchurch Local History Society**

The Woodchurch Local History Society meets on the first Monday of the month to hear talks about topics of local historical interest. Our next talk is on Monday June 3<sup>rd</sup> when we



are due to hear Alex Ferris of the Smarden LHS give us an illustrated presentation entitled 'Smarden- The Village of Fear'. Alex's presentation starts with the news that a number of dairy cows were dying in the fields of Smarden in June 1963. The problem worsened with the deaths of sheep, dogs

and a goat. The cause of the problem was quickly identified but the affair dragged on for about a year. The affair led to national headlines and eventually resulted in



improved environmental protection measures.

If you want to hear how Smarden coped with this issue and how new environmental policies were introduced then please come along.

Visitors are always very welcome and pay £3 at the door. There is no need to pre-book - just turn up on the night. We hope to see you there.

New members are also welcome and pay £12 annually as subscription.

After our June meeting we 'break up' for the summer and return in September and have monthly talks until December. After September new members pay a £6 half-yearly subscription.





Traditionally, May is our Resolutions Meeting when each WI is obliged to discuss and vote for the selected resolution to go forward to the Annual Meeting, which this year will be held on 5th June at the Royal Albert Hall in London. The resolution concerns Dental Health Matters and reads:- "There is a chronic shortage of NHS Dentists and people are suffering health issues as a result. The NFWI calls on the Government to increase investment in the training and retention of dentists and to review the current inadequate NHS Contracts, in order to ensure that everyone can access an NHS dentist wherever they live". A lively discussion ensued when it was pointed out that more training was required not only for dentists, but also dental nurses, hygienists and dental therapists. The importance of good dental hygiene, eating a healthy diet and not smoking for all potential patients was also stressed. Following this discussion, it was unanimously agreed to vote in favour of the resolution and discretion was also given to our delegate to decide how to vote after debate at the Annual Meeting, should there be any amendments to the existing resolution.

Prior to all the above, we were pleased to welcome Mr. Toby Mynott, from nearby Redbrook Street, as our Speaker for the evening. 

### The Big Switch-Off 2025


#### WHAT EXACTLY IS THE BIG SWITCH-OFF?
