WOODCHURCH SURGERY UPDATE

Everyone at the Surgery is looking forward to welcoming you in 2025. It seems incredible that Christmas has come and gone so quickly and we can look forward to the next one now. I have to say that I had a great couple of days off and it was a brilliant time to relax with the family.

I unexpectedly picked a friend up from the William Harvey on Boxing Day and was pleasantly surprised to see everyone in good spirits. I was shocked, though, to see the wards so full and apparently new areas with beds in that I don't remember seeing before. It was definitely a good reminder that if we look after ourselves as best we can then we stand in a better position to avoid being in a bed there ourselves.

Unfortunately, some admissions are unintentionally contributed to by complications related to medication. Although we have a number of checks, sometimes the holes in the Swiss Cheese align and something slips through. Please



make sure that if you take medication that you have a review done at least once a year. It is likely that you need a blood test or a physical check to monitor and if you think this hasn't happened in the last 12 months then it is worth booking in a

review. Please also make sure that you are aware that some medication should be stopped if you are at risk of dehydration from an acute illness - this can prevent unintended complications.



We have welcomed two new trainees to the team and both have settled in well. Dr "B K" has joined us for 4 months and splits his time between us and the hospice; Dr Chika Ohio is with us full time and should be completing his training in August 2025 as long as his exams go to plan.

We continue to grow as a Surgery and are looking to grow the team. We have advertised for some more talented people to join our team, so if you want to be part of the brilliant team or know someone that might be interested please get in touch. We are looking forward to welcoming a new nurse, receptionist/administrator and dispensary manager over the next few months.

We now push through dry January and welcome the Year of the Snake at the end of the month for the Chinese New Year. I'm looking forward to that and wish you all a very happy British New Year on behalf of the Surgery.

The Draft Budget for 2025-2026

The Parish Council will be agreeing the budget for 2025-2026 at the next meeting on 23rd January 2025. Ashford Borough Council announced the "tax base" on which parish councils set the precept (the amount the parish council collects in your council tax). For Woodchurch this would mean an insignificant change should the precept remain unchanged.

Community Wardens

As an update following the decision by Kent County Council to withdraw the Community Warden from Woodchurch, the Clerk has approached other parish councils to ascertain if there is any interest in sharing the cost for one, to cover those parishes.

Yellow Lines?

At the recent Parish Council meeting it was agreed to ask residents for their views on installing yellow lines around the school. There will be a public consultation put out to the village on the topic, which will then be reflected back to East Kent Highways. Additionally East Kent Highways will be installing 30 MPH roundels on the road surface approaching the village along Bethersden Road.

Safety and Security

We have been looking into security around the village, and would like to explore alternatives to installing CCTV. The Council feels that it needs to demonstrate good value for money to the residents before any decisions are made.

In memory of Geoff Loynes (1934-2024)

Geoff Loynes was born near Hereford on 20 August 1934. By WW2 the family had moved to London; then Geoff was evacuated to Minehead (Somerset). After getting back to London, he found his way to the Rudolf Steiner Waldorf School in Forest Row (East Sussex). His father worked for Walt Disney as an animator.

Geoff lived alone in Battersea and Streatham and spent a lot of time in the big South Kensington museums. He used to dream of having his own museum. In 1972 Geoff and Daphne met through a 'lonely hearts' newspaper column and married in Streatham. They first lived in Swanley and then Wrotham Heath. Later they were at Stelling Minnis and Brookland at Brooker Cottage. Charlotte was born in 1973 and Danny in 1974.

Professionally he was a cartoonist who worked on many well-known animated films - The Beatles "Yellow Submarine", "Bananaman", "Mr Men" and "Aladdin" were perhaps among his best known. Geoff followed his father into this trade without any training; he was self-taught. He also appeared in several films and on TV, including "Where Monsters Go", "Inventions that changed the World", "The Mystery of Edwin Drood", "Merry Christmas Mr Bean" and he was the face of Christmas in many of the Comet adverts.



The family came to Woodchurch in 1979 and settled at Hornbrook Manor Farmhouse. By the early 1980s Geoff was collecting local historical artefacts, which soon filled his barn and outhouses. This included the 1901 Brougham (a carriage). Geoff also acquired a horse called Meg. He hitched Meg to the Brougham and offered horse-drawn transport for Woodchurch weddings. In his spare time he enjoyed being Father Christmas in the village hall to amuse the young.

In 1983 Geoff decided that Woodchurch needed a village museum to house his collection and appealed in the parish magazine for like minds to come forward and help, following which the museum project with fund raising and

exhibitions was launched. One of these was the 1985 'Woodchurch at War' display in the village. Over the next few years, Geoff was joined by others, and in 1989 they had found a site for the Museum, and an 18th century barn to erect upon it. That year Geoff also helped to establish "Wings and Things" (the Woodchurch air show) that was held at Little Engeham Farm with the aim of fund-raising for the Museum. This event would be held for the next 18 years, growing annually with over 8,000 people attending the last show. One of the highlights of Wings and Things was "Geoff's field" in which he organised many vintage fairground rides for the enjoyment of the visitors.



Around 1994 Geoff became the museums Life President and Joanna Lumley opened the Museum in 2001.



In August 2012 Geoff and Daphne moved away from Woodchurch after 33 years here. First they lived at Bonnington and finally settled in Basingstoke, nearer the family. Even after moving away, Geoff remained dedicated to Woodchurch and to the museum.

In 2014, Geoff and Charlotte enjoyed an afternoon garden party at Buckingham Palace, an event for people who had "achieved something important". Unassuming Geoff was mystified as to how he had been invited and was amazed that the organisers seemed to know all about his work to create the museum.

Towards the end of his life Geoff suffered from dementia and he died on Saturday 7th December 2024 of a heart attack.

Throughout his life, and following the announcement of his death, Geoff received many tributes from people who knew him or had met him.

Geoffs funeral will be held at Redan Road Cemetery, Aldershot, Hampshire, GU12 4RW at 1:00pm on Friday 3rd January 2025.

This will be followed by a reception at Island View, Shortwood Copse Lane, Basingstoke. RG23 7GU



INTRODUCTION for new readers.

My name is Peter New I am a Police Volunteer with Kent Police and work in Community Neighbourhood Watch across the whole Ashford District. My Force number is 91725.



I will be producing a NHW Plan for Woodchurch in partnership with the Woodchurch Parish Council.

My priorities to address the risks within Woodchurch will be clearly laid out with one of the main ones being how to develop and grow the Neighbourhood Watch membership within the village. If you have not yet joined, please do. It is completely free. The Village Pump - 32 years ago

2025 will see the Village Pump restored to its former glory. When it was painted by a Woodchurch resident in 1993 it attracted comment from throughout the village. Below is an article by Reggie Pellett that appeared in the 1993 Parish Magazine concerning the fetching of water from the pump.

OUR VILLAGE PUMP

How nice to see the village pump painted in two-tone. Congratulations Mister Frain - excellent job!

I wonder how many readers realize what a jubilant day it must have been in 1878 when the village pump was installed. Men, women and children lined the road with buckets to get their first taste of fresh water. Some would have been used to drinking rain water, contaminated with all kinds of bacteria as the rain ran down the roof and into large wooden barrels placed at the side of the house.

Many, I feel, were in for a shock on receiving their quota, with the weight of water they had to carry away. For a couple given two gallon buckets of water the weight would be forty pounds (18.144 Kilograms). I can imagine the following conversation taking place

"I'll tell you what, Mary, I'll make my husband fetch this water next time for he jolly well knows I'm in no fit state."

Some, I feel sure, didn't appreciate the real advantage of fresh water -

"I don't care what you say, Rosey, that 'er well water don't make a cup of tea like that 'er rain water!"

"01' Joe Tiller is right, drinking water should come from the clouds above, and not from water under the ground".

"The trouble with you my husband, you're too darn lazy to go and fetch it."
"No I aint!"

"O yes you is!"

Once again, we hope you all had a fantastic start to 2025 and hope to see you all soon!




