

Dear Friends,

I know that many people will be celebrating as we move from Winter to Spring this month. For many people I speak to, this winter seems to have been a time of sadness and gloom. We can



feel weighed down by all sorts of things. Recently on TV they were talking about record breaking numbers of days when we have had cloud cover with grey skies and no sight of the sun sometimes for 10 days or more. This can also be a difficult time financially as we recover from perhaps overspending at Christmas, or just trying to cope with the cost of heating and groceries. This also feels a difficult time when we are mourning the loss of loved ones; currently we are supporting a number of families who have recently been bereaved, perhaps you are remembering a loved one who has died. Whatever the reason, if you are feeling sad, please reach out to those around you - friends, family, neighbours, or one of our parish team who are always happy to come and chat or talk on the phone.

The wonderful thing about our seasons is that Spring is coming; the daffodils are flowering and we can see everything coming alive in our gardens and in the countryside around us; soon we will be able to enjoy the Spring lambs too! This is a wonderful reminder of God's presence in the world and in our lives.

On 4th March it will be Shrove Tuesday. Traditionally the day when Christians use up food items before a time of prayer and fasting in lent, which lasts until Easter Sunday (40 days not counting Sundays). I wonder if you still have a tradition of cooking pancakes?

The following day is Ash Wednesday. The first day of Lent. We have services on that day to reflect on the time ahead of us, to consider not only if we might give something up during Lent, but what we might do more of... perhaps an extra time of prayer each day, an act of kindness, or helping someone in need. At our Ash Wednesday services (the main one this year is 7pm on 5th March in All Saints Church) we are marked with a cross in ash on our forehead to remind us of our mortality and to repent or say sorry for the things we have done wrong. The ashes are made from burning the palm crosses used in church on Palm Sunday last year. We are reminded that "you are dust and to dust you shall return".

Do join us at one of our services, our lent group or coffee mornings during the season of Lent - you will find a warm welcome in all of our village church.




we are busy renovating the Community Hall Social Shed.


RISK AREAS & CRIME TRENDS TO BE ALERT TO.

- 3 SHEDS, BARNS, GARAGES, STABLES and any form of EXTERNAL STORAGE

4 - ROGUE TRADERS & BOGUS CALLERS.

This is a very worrying concern. Please do not agree to any unsolicited work on your doorstep no matter how cheap and attractive the price.

These criminals will seek out our disabled, vulnerable and elderly, especially they will target that group if they live alone. Internet shopping parcels stolen from doorsteps. It may be that a rural community does not face the same risk from a "chancer and opportunist passer-by however the danger now in rural areas is the vans are now followed by criminals so even the most remote rural property could suffer a theft.

WOODCHURCH SURGERY UPDATE

I'm hoping that the daffodils have managed to grow up quickly and be ready for St David's Day as the weather seems to have stunted the signs of spring so far. We will then be ready for a very late Pancake Day which coincides with March being a National Nutrition Month. There really isn't anything particularly healthy in a pancake



but making them is fun and becomes a good family event.

It is worth having a browse in the British Diabetic Association website where there are some really useful tips around healthy eating, about living to try and avoid diabetes and learning to live with it. Some estimates suggest 1 in 9 adults are living with pre-diabetes which means that your body's response to digesting and breaking down sugar is delayed or impaired. Without serious effort this will develop into Type 2 diabetes and you then run into the risks of complications. Fortunately, we have a brilliant diabetic team, however we would prefer that you don't have to meet them!

Brain Cancer is also thrust into the spotlight this month and of all the illnesses, I suspect we have all considered at some



point if our headache or visual distortion might be a sign of a brain tumour. Less. than 1% of us will be affected in our lifetime and the peak age group is distorted to people age 85-90 years old. This is partly because a high proportion are secondary cancers from a primary

disease of another organ such as the lung or breast.

Unfortunately, most primary brain tumours present with quite sudden symptoms such as a new seizure, signs of a stroke, persistent vomiting or sudden change in mental behaviour. The symptoms that we consider "Red flags" include severe and frequent headaches, seizures, vision problems, difficulty speaking, cognitive and memory issues, numbness or weakness on one side of the body, sudden personality changes and coordination difficulties.

If these symptoms present, we would consider an acute admission for an MRI scan of the head or refer under the "2 week wait cancer pathway". These pathways are developed to investigate potential cancers but it is important to remember that most of the referrals we make will not result in a cancer diagnosis.

We have welcomed Abbey to the reception team and look forward to the arrival of Mandy to the dispensing team who will be learning the ropes at the hatch. We hope you will all give her the usual warm Woodchurch welcome while Kaz will be learning some more about the dispensing and work towards her dispensing qualifications.

Chris Hamilton, our Nurse Practitioner, will be retiring at the end of March and we will certainly miss her huge knowledge, charisma and the spirit that she has added to the team for

the last 21 years. She has justifiably been very proud of her stats for Woodchurch frequently being top-ranked in Kent for diabetes management and we will really miss her. She will hopefully enjoy all her hobbies even more now and you might see her at dance classes, wool festivals, rabbit events or a Fencing Salle. We hope you all join us in wishing her and her husband, Ian, well for the future - thank you for everything you have done.

The aims, objectives and visions for the new version of the Plan will be debated over the coming meetings in order to have the new version agreed by the end of April. This will then be presented to voters at the Annual Parish Meeting of the voters - likely late May early June this year.


